WA'A KAUKAHI (single hull canoes)

7:30 – 7:40 am Wāhine, Mix 50+ & 60+ start in Kailua Bay

**11:45 – 11:55 am Kāne, Mix Open & 40+ start in
Hōnaunau Bay**

Women and Mix 40+ start the race paddling 18 miles from Kailua Bay to Hōnaunau. The Men and Mix Open then bring it back 18 miles to Kailua Bay. The Iron Division crews race the entire course with no changes!

AWARD PRESENTATION

TORCHLIGHT PARADE

Torchlight parade through Historic Kailua Village starts at 7:00 pm. Participants meet at Hale Hālāwai County Pavilion. Parade winds its way through Historic Kailua Village starting at Hale Hālāwai County Pavilion and ending at the Kailua Pier.

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 4

Starting at 7:00 am • Kailua Pier

TEEN (single hull canoes)

Four teen divisions (OC6 – 6 person crews): 14, 15 16, 18 and under, Mix 18 and under. The young people paddling this race follow the same course as the double hull canoes.

WA'A KAULUA (double hull canoes)

Crews of 12 paddlers lash together two single hull canoes to make the double hulls. Throughout the morning, the double hulls are raced in women, men and mix divisions. The course takes the wa'a (canoe) 2.5 miles south and returns to Kailua Bay for a total of 5 miles.

OC1 (one person) & OC2 RACES (two person)

The OC1 and OC2 canoe races are a recent addition to the more traditional racing events. The men and women paddling in this one follow the same course as the double-hull canoes.

Mix (3 Wāhine / 3 Kane) iron crews paddle to Banyans, turn and finish at the Kailua Pier

8:00 am Race start • Kailua Bay

50+ and 55+ divisions

9:30 am Race start • Kailua Bay

60+, 65+ and 70+ divisions

Awards brunch to follow under the tent on the Kailua Pier.
