Crews of 12 paddlers lash together two single hull canoes to make the double hulls. Throughout the morning, the double hulls are raced in women, men and mix divisions. The course takes the wa'a (canoe) 2.5 miles south and returns to Kailua Bay for a total of 5 miles.

OC1 (one person) & OC2 RACES (two person)

The OC1 and OC2 canoe races are a recent addition to the more traditional racing events. The men and women paddling in this one follow the same course as the double-hull canoes.
